Avita Community Partners, formerly Georgia

Mountains Community Services, is a public agency formed by the 1993 Georgia State Legislature to serve persons experiencing the disabling effects of mental illness, developmental disabilities, and substance use disorders.

Avita's mission is to improve quality of life for
persons with behavioral health and developmental
disabilities.

Adult Behavioral Health Programs

provide psychiatric treatment, counseling, and other recovery
support services for adults with mental illnesses, emotional
disorders and substance use disorders.

Individual, Family & Group Counseling Services provide supportive
psychotherapy for persons with mental illness and addictive disease, and
brief therapy for persons experiencing a crisis related to an emotional or
adjustment disorder.

Services are based on individual needs and available resources.

Fees can be paid by clients, family members, Medicare, Medicaid, Veterans
Administration, and commercial insurance. Funding is also provided by the
Georgia Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities.
Some individuals may qualify for a reduced rate by supplying information to
substantiate their financial situation. A reasonable charge is set for services
offered. No one is turned away due to inability to pay.

Case Management, Community Support & Psychosocial Rehabilitation Services provide outreach, resource coordination, and rehabilitative
skills training services to assist persons with severe and persistent
mental illness maintain safe and stable community housing,
independent living skills, and access to community services.

Peer Support Program is provided by Certified Peer Specialists who
have progressed through their own recovery and now can offer help to
other adults with severe and persistent mental illness.

Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) provides a 24 hours 7-days
a week community-based behavioral healthcare for persons living
with a severe, persistent mental illness who have not been effectively
supported with traditional clinic-based treatment services.

HIV Early Intervention Services provide testing for human
immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and Hepatitis C. Counseling services and
education related to HIV and Hepatitis C are also available.

Substance Use Disorder Outpatient Program provides individual
and group counseling. This is a cost effective alternative to hospital
or residential treatment for persons with a substance use disorder.
Services are provided by Certified Addiction Counselors and Licensed
Clinicians.

Community Housing Programs provide outreach and 7-days a week
support to help individuals obtain and maintain optimal independent
living in their community.

Supported Employment Programs assist persons with behavioral health
and developmental disabilities with finding, getting, and keeping a
job. To accomplish this, Avita partners with area employers to identify
opportunities, provide training, and ongoing supports that enable
success.

Women's Treatment & Recovery Support (WTRS) is a residential
addiction treatment program for women and includes therapeutic child
care for children under 12 years old. WTRS is funded by the Georgia
Department of Family & Children Services (DFCS).

American Sign Language (ASL) Project employs ASL-fluent staff to
provide specialized behavioral health services for persons who are deaf
or hearing-impaired.

Emerging Adults specialized supports for individuals ages 16-26 with, or
at risk for Mental Health challenges.

Community Support Team (CST) is an intensive behavioral health
service for individuals with severe mental illness living in rural areas
who require a higher level of care than traditional outpatient services.

Accountability Court Programs are criminal justice reform initiatives
established to provide treatment in lieu of incarceration for nonviolent
offenders with a behavioral health disorder.

Behavioral Health Crisis Center for adults (BHCC) offers 24/7 walk-in
crisis services, Peer Living Room, 23-hour Observation Unit, and Crisis
Stabilization Unit (CSU). The CSU offers short-term residential care
for psychiatric stabilization and alcohol/drug detoxification with a
specialty unit for those with co-occurring I/DD. This is a less restrictive
and cost effective alternative to hospital care for persons experiencing a
behavioral health crisis.

Medication Management Services provide physician, nursing, and
pharmacy services for persons with severe mental illnesses.

Youth Services provides treatment and support for
children and adolescents, and their parents or guardians, with
behavioral, emotional, and substance use disorders.

Outpatient Mental Health Services provide psychiatric treatment
and counseling for youth and their families in community-based
clinics and schools. Licensed clinicians work with children and
adolescents to enhance their mental, emotional, and social
functioning.

Adolescent Substance Use Disorders provide early intervention and
counseling for youth and their family.

Child/Adolescent Clubhouses are unique after school and weekend
programs that provide recreational alternatives as well as counseling
and support services for at risk youth in a safe and supportive
environment.

Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) Services utilize the principles of
applied behavior analysis (ABA). Families of individuals with ASD are
now able to access adaptive behavior treatment services through
any of Avita's outpatient clinics across the region. The Autism
Treatment Program is currently open for children, adolescents, and
adults under the age of 21.

Developmental Disability Programs

enable adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities to
participate in communities activities, and be as independent as
possible. A key priority is to support persons served in pursuing
their life goals and dreams, to facilitate access to community
activities and opportunities, and to enable their giving back
to community through employment, volunteer work, or other
opportunities.

Community Access Services provides opportunities and support
that enable individuals to participate in a variety of community life
experiences and to optimize independent living skills.

Community Living Supports are in-home services designed to enable
IDD adults to lead an independent life while remaining in their own
home or with family. CLS services are tailored to meet the individuals
needs and preferences while enhancing their daily life.

Family Support Services assist families in obtaining specialized
medical supplies, equipment, and other assistance that focuses on
helping families with difficulties.

Respite Services are individuals or families who can give short-term
relief to family members and other caretakers who need a break by
caring for their loved ones with special needs on a temporary basis.

Host Family Services are provided by caring families who welcome
persons with a developmental disability into their home and support
him or her with care, dignity, and respect and provide a safe living
environment.
